A highlight of the event was the introduction of our inaugural **Community Impact Award** recipients—four organizations that use the arts in powerful ways to engage underserved communities—were awarded \$5,000 each: GableStage, Miami City Ballet, Museum of Contemporary Art, and New World Symphony.

As this was our first year offering these awards, the Designated Grants Committee, led by **Harriet Gershman** and **Terri Mason**, will review the process and propose refinements to ensure we continue supporting organizations that go above and beyond to bring the arts to underserved communities.


GRANTEE SNAPSHOT

The FAN website now features a detailed look at this year's 21 grantees, offering insights by annual budget size, artistic discipline, and number of first-time awardees. It's truly inspiring to see how widely FAN's support is spread across organizations of all sizes and disciplines.

Grantees span four budget categories:

- Micro (under \$1 million) 7 grantees: Arts Ballet of Florida, Dimensions Dance, Hued Songs, M Ensemble, Miami Short Film Festival, Peter London Global Dance Company, and Zoetic Stage.
- Small (\$1M-2.99M) 7 grantees: FIU Wertheim School of Music, Frost Art Museum, GableStage, Locust Projects, Miami Film Festival, Nu Deco Ensemble, and Seraphic Fire.
- Medium (\$3M-\$10M) 4 grantees: Florida Grand Opera, Jewish Film Festival, Lowe Museum, and Miami New Drama.
- Large (\$20M and above) 3 grantees: Adrienne Arscht Center, Miami City Ballet, and New World Symphony.

Grantee Breakdown by Budget Category




Grantee distribution by budget category, showing an even split between Micro and Small organizations, with fewer Medium and Large.

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

What motivated you to join FAN?

I've long admired FAN for its deep commitment to supporting the local arts community. During my time at Oolite Arts, I've seen firsthand how FAN's programming and generous grants make a real impact. Becoming a part of that mission felt like a natural next step.

What is your current role at Oolite Arts?

I've spent my entire adult life in the art world, and my journey has led me to this exciting new chapter as Interim Director of Programming. My work continues to be guided by a genuine passion for supporting artists and advancing Oolite's mission to help them create and thrive.

Can you tell us something about yourself that most people don't already know?

I'm a huge fan of both tennis and football! Last year, I had the amazing opportunity to attend the Paris Olympics and watch some of the world's best tennis players compete. Attending a Super Bowl is still on my bucket list. A lover of both art and sports—go figure!

Can you share a project you're particularly proud of?

One project that's especially close to my heart is the Shares membership program at Oolite Arts, which I've led since its inception. It invites local artists to create a special edition of 50 artworks—often in new mediums—and gives collectors a unique way to begin or grow a collection of Miami-based art. It's a meaningful bridge between artists and supporters, and I'm proud of the platform it provides for creative experimentation and connection.

Tell us about your background and how the arts first became part of your life?

My mother was a fiber artist and helped instill in me a love of crafts. I grew into a passionate arts fan in college, through courses in art and music history, and by going to the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Barnes Foundation, and the Symphony.

Tell us about your passion for the culinary arts.

For 12 years, I've been writing miamicurated.com, a blog on food, fashion, culture and travel, and it's now the #2 food blog in Miami and #12 in Florida. Beyond enjoying fine food, I've developed a deep appreciation for the creativity in its presentation—something that's practically essential in today's top restaurants.

What is the most rewarding part of your work?

Before founding my agency, KWE Partners, I worked for Hilton International Hotels and was inspired by Conrad Hilton's belief in "World Peace through International Trade and Travel." I've always believed that travel fosters cross-cultural understanding, supports economic growth in developing countries, and offers a deeply personal sense of discovery. Experiencing new cultures and civilizations is a lifelong passion—and the most rewarding part of what I do.

Tell us something about yourself that most people don't already know.

I've always been fascinated by different cultures. At 16, I won a statewide essay contest in Delaware on the importance of the United Nations—that moment sparked a lifelong passion for global connection through travel. I once considered a career in education, which led me to accept a position as an adjunct professor of American literature and composition at the National University in Bogotá, Colombia. While living there, I traveled to Brazil, fell in love with the country, and became fluent in both Spanish and Portuguese.

What motivated you to join FAN-and stay involved?

I've been a FAN member for about six years. I always tell friends that FAN is a unique way to support the arts—not just through financial contributions, but by experiencing some of Miami's top visual and performing arts alongside others who share that passion. Being a member means learning more about our city's cultural landscape and, as a screener, even meeting the creative leaders behind the scenes. That combination keeps me inspired and engaged year after year.
